Summary

Odeh Abu Tayeh was born in 1850. He was the fourth of five sons and one sister called Alya, and he was famous for protecting her, so he came to be known as "Alya's Brother". His father Harb Abu Tayeh was the leader of the Eastern branch of Al-Huwaitat family. Odeh assumed leadership when he was 20 years old (despite having older brothers), and he soon gained a reputation among the tribes and became famous all over the desert, not only the Bedouins feared his raids, but also the Ottoman Empire men. He was also a refuge for anyone who was sentenced to jail or evading taxes or running away from compulsory military service; which was perhaps the reason why American journalist Lowell Thomas to dub him "Robin Hood".

Dramatic Plot

The hostility was heightened between the Ottoman Empire and Odeh, who was one of the Bedouin leaders for whom Faisal, son of Sharif Hussein sent to revolt against the Turkish rule, and he responded without hesitation, and in early April 1917 headed immediately to Faisal's camp in Al-Wajh area, and his arrival opened the doors wide for military action, and he freed Aqaba, a feat the British failed to achieve, thus taking the military action to the heart of the Turkish front in an area which they considered immune, which caused the revolution to spread to Greater Syria.
